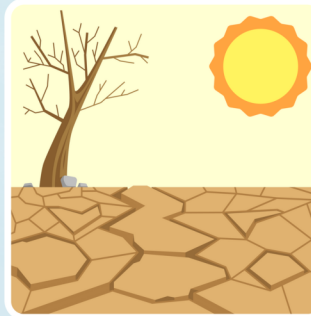

Ocean Currents

Winds drive surface ocean currents, which are critical for global heat distribution.

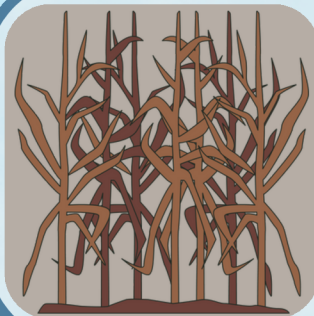
Collapse of Ocean Currents: Major currents like the Gulf Stream would stop, leading to drastic climate changes, particularly in Europe and North America.

Stagnant Oceans: Without mixing caused by currents, oxygen levels in deeper ocean layers would decrease, leading to dead zones.

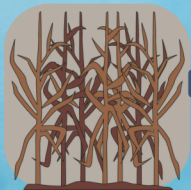
Oxygen & Crop Supply

Many plants rely on wind for seed and pollen dispersal. Without wind, plant reproduction and genetic diversity would suffer. Trees would fail to convert carbon dioxide into oxygen, entire ecosystems would collapse. The food supply for humans and animals would become critically endangered.

Animal Life

Earth's ecosystems would become unstable and food supplies would dwindle. Herbivores would be the first to suffer, leading to widespread predator starvation and a domino effect throughout the food chain. Only a few resilient, adaptable species would survive, likely in isolated and extreme environments. The entire planet would face mass extinctions, with only the hardest species capable of surviving the harsh, stagnant conditions.

Energy Crisis



Only 30% of the world's energy comes from renewable sources. By this point, non-renewable energy conversion would already have ceased. Now wind energy, which supplies 9%, hydropower, which supplies 15%, and solar power, which provides 4.4%, would all be eliminated as power sources, cutting our energy supplies to only existing batteries and burning available fuel sources like wood.

Air Quality

Wind helps disperse air pollutants. Without it, smog and pollution would linger over urban areas, leading to more health problems. The lack of wind and death of plant life would lead to a build up of CO₂, worsening the greenhouse effect. The atmosphere would become denser and more stratified, possibly leading to a reduction in overall air circulation and livable zones.

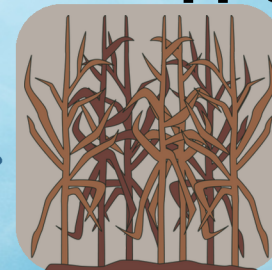
